Emerging Issues Working Group – Terms of Reference

On behalf of AMP, the Emerging Issues Working Group (EIWG) provides support to AMP by identifying and addressing emergent issues related to scaling up ITN ownership and use before, during, and after mass distribution campaigns.

The EIWG will focus on:

- a) Identifying critical issues to monitor, address and advise on behalf of the AMP partnership;
- b) Serving as a catalyst on critical issues by raising them to the attention of the AMP general body as well as other relevant bodies, such as the VCWG, GMP, NMCPs, etc.; and,
- c) Disseminating resources on identified emerging issues to the AMP partnership as they become available.

The EIWG will function as a liaison with relevant RBM working groups, such as the Vector Control Working Group, as well as with interested individuals within and beyond the AMP to identify ways forward.

The EIWG expects to generate a number of products for the AMP partnership, including:

- a) Draft policy positions for AMP consideration and adoption.
- b) Referral of issues to appropriate AMP working groups for operational consideration (OR, M&E, BCC, Sustaining Gains, etc).
- c) Review and update AMP guidance products as appropriate.
- d) Provide appropriate links to related RBM working groups.
