Expanding the ownership and use of mosquito nets

Context:

- NMCP (National Malaria Control Program) and Plan International Liberia are co-PRs in the management of the Global Fund financed 2018 Liberia campaign.
- 2,615,371 LLINs were procured and in process of being distributed with the objective of achieving universal coverage of 5,103,499 registered population in the country's 15 counties and 93 health districts.

Observations

- Distribution training has been implemented in April 23-24.
- Launch of the campaign was merged with the World Malaria Day on 25 April, 2018.
- Few districts started a day or two later after the official start date of 26 April, 2018.
- Urban DPs on average distributing more nets than rural ones. One of the urban DP indicated to have distributed 10 bales (500nets) the first day and 6 (300) bales the second day.
- All DPs distributed, along the nets, a flier with instructions on how to hang and use the net.
- There was no crowd disorder or security threat observed or reported.
- Vouchers are well kept and stacked.
- LLIN storage space and conditions were adequate in two sites where they had over 20 bales in stock.
- Plastic waste under control in most DPs.
- On days 5 and 6, many teams transformed into outreach and mobile sites trying to reach the population in their communities and speed up the distribution.

Issues:

- Late arrival of nets at DPs.
- Distribution very slow in both rural and urban areas.
- Some DP had low turn up.

- All visited sites were fixed sites. Some sites were very far from the communities they served. Not certain that additional DPs were identified in the area.
- None of the visited DPs displayed a banner to identify the DP.
- Only one DP had the household registration forms at the site.
- No cross-checking voucher with household registration forms.
- Only two DPs among visited were cross-checking beneficiary vouchers with vouchers stubs.
- Some DPs were giving more than 3 nets (up to 15-20 nets) to one person collecting nets on behalf of other community members. When asked, people responded that others are busy and the DP is too far from the community.
- Some DPs copied the beneficiary names and voucher numbers instead of referring to the registration lists and/or vouchers stubs.
- Many DPs asked the beneficiaries to sign or put their finger prints at the back of the vouchers.
- Tally sheets and stock sheets were indiscriminately to indicate the number of nets delivered to the beneficiary.
- No stock cards for daily inventory record at distribution sites.
- Different procedure understanding and implementation and lack of uniformity in operation across DPs.
- Since no county completed the distribution after 6 days, the NMCP and the campaign National Joint Technical Steering Committee (JTSC) have decided and gave instruction to all implementing partners and authorities to:
 - a. Comply providing daily updates and analysis and,
 - b. Continue distribution for another 3 days, though only one day out of the 3 will be paid for by MOH.

The week ahead

- Given the period extension, continue field visit and observation of distribution
- Final distribution results analysis, debriefing and report preparation.
