# **Country Updates**

Updates provided during the call: Pakistan, Sudan, Cameroon

#### Pakistan

- Campaign delayed again, the exact date has not yet been identified, but all teams agree on the need to distribute nets by the end of December
- The reason of delay is that the implementing partner could not meet all the obligations. Some of the officials were not aware of tendering process and specific requirements were not respected. The tender process for transportation and materials has been stopped
- The responsibilities related to recruitment of staff member, and procurement of transportation have been reassigned
- The risk of campaign spilling out to 2021 is getting higher

#### Sudan

- All stakeholders are looking into ways to distribute the nets in 2020, accelerated timeline has been produced. The door-to-door distribution is now scheduled to take place on Christmas day
- Teams are trying to achieve acceleration in all activities, microplanning and training activities should happen shortly
- Teams have been distracted with grant making process
- AMP TA submitted SBC tools, training materials are being prepared
- AMP TA is supporting the country team as much as possible
- Country needs to align to our TA plan as little to no knowledge of AMP TA in the new management, calls have been organized to explain and support with transition to new ways of doing distribution

## Cameroun

- Distribution has started in North West region, NMCP and team leading on implementation
- Situation is tense due to security issues in the region as well as communication gaps
- Single phase now stretching in 3 phases, creating tension between teams but also within communities, some communities received nets others no
- The absence of clear plan of net arrival have significant implications
- Good lessons learned summary was produced based on team experience from previous phases
- Meetings are held every night to align the work for the day ahead
- Transport is another serious issue that needs to be addressed
