Country summary	
Jan. 6 th update	 Elections in late December 2020 were very challenging for the country which resulted in large population movements. ITNs that have been distributed to date have been lost during population movements Country is currently experiencing challenges in getting diagnosis and treatment to health facilities 900,000 ITNs are planned to be distributed in Bangui in June / July 2021 Country is still planning for distribution in June / July to go ahead Country will request AMP TA in 2021

Jan. 6 th update	 AMP did a review of ITN distribution documents during the last quarter of 2020 NMCP has provided responses to all AMP comments Country has developed a 1 month - 3 month - 12 month evaluation plan Country will discuss next steps with AMP and Tropical Health

Jan. 6 th update	 ITNs are currently being distributed in 3 provinces 500,000 ITNs have been distributed in Tanganika The country is using mobile phones to support all ITN distributions Overall the distribution is going very well other than delays

Ghana

Jan. 6 th update	 School based distribution at the end of 2020 went well and more that 1.1 million ITNs were distributed. The distribution needed to be adapted to COVID context as schools were closed

Kenya	
Country summary	
Jan. 6 th update	 Pilot distribution of 200,000 ITNs completed. NMCP is very happy with results The use of vouchers was initially removed due to COVID but then put back in due to compliance concerns and an effort to internal controls are in place. Country will look at results of the first ITN distribution as large numbers of population left Nairobi for the interior due to COVID
