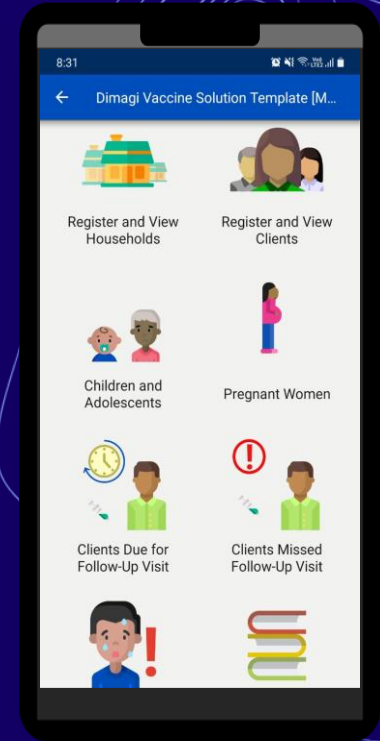

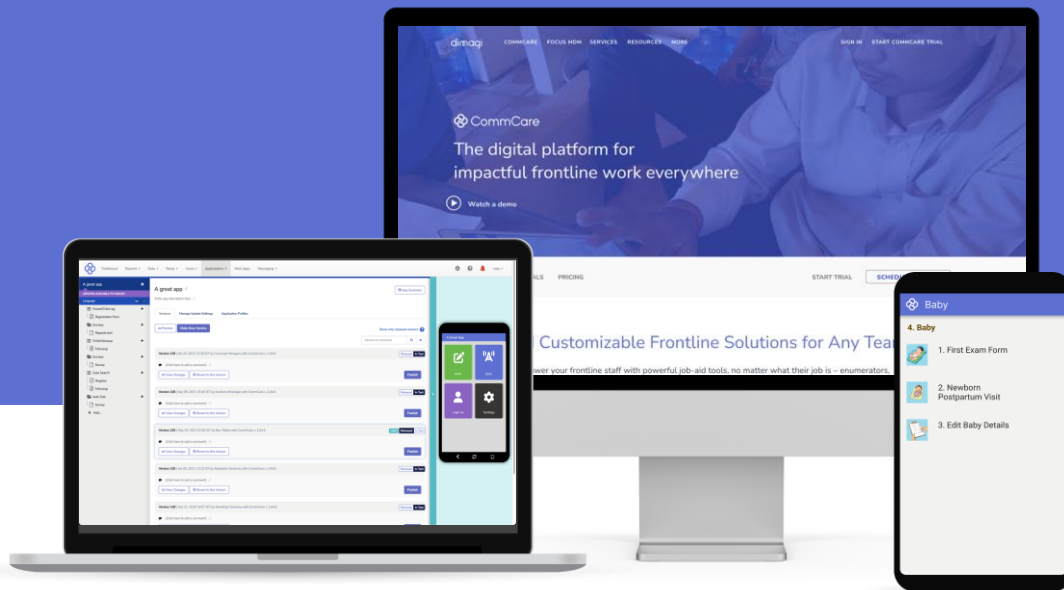

Case Studies

Spotlight: World Vision Sahel Project



Who: Dimagi is supporting Raise 4 Sahel, a four-year project (2022-2025) funded by GAVI.

What: The project aims to identify and vaccinate zero dose children (ZDC) and under immunized children (UIC).

Where: All work is done in fragile and conflict-affected contexts in 7 Sahel region countries, including Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Niger, Nigeria and Mali.





CommCare & COVID-19 Vaccine Delivery

In 2020, Dimagi developed a solution for the equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccines (read more [here](#)). The solution has been used at national scale in multiple countries with over 2.8 million vaccine doses tracked across deployments.

Those learnings have helped to inform our approach to developing and scaling tools for routine immunization.

Through a multilateral partnership, CommCare was adapted for Jamaica's Ministry of Health and Wellness and deployed in hundreds of hospitals, health centers, and COVID-19 vaccination sites.

- Integrated with Jamaica's national COVID-19 vaccine scheduler so recipients can be pre-registered into the system before their appointments.
- Data collected through the application is fed into a dashboard that visualizes various elements of the vaccine campaign
