

# Select AMP 2023 workplan achievements as of September 2023

- Effectively managed project close out of BMGF grant
- Submitted proposal to BMGF for next three-year investment
- Hired consultant to support coordination of AMP TA and the 2023 annual partners meetings
- Jan-June 2023: completed 52 TA missions to 14 countries, mostly hybrid
- Facilitated three NMCP country-to-country exchanges future funding mechanisms unclear
- Completed data collection for waste management review

# AMP Annual Meeting and Digitalization Meeting Nairobi, May 2023

#### **Meeting participation:**

- AMP Annual Partners Meeting: 204 participants attended (152 in-person/ 52 virtually)
- Digitalization Meeting: 205 participants attended (152 in-person/ 53 virtually)

#### **Participant evaluation:**

- Top likes: overall organization, interaction moderators, presenters, and participants, face-toface meeting & networking, diversity of countries, quality of presentations
- Concerns: too many partner side meetings, back-to-back presentations—need more discussion time

#### **Recommendations:**

- Hold future meetings in malaria endemic countries
- Reduce number of presentations to increase discussion
- Continue to have overall meeting theme
- Make lunch meetings less formal presentation, more discussion oriented







# Core Group decisions on AMP annual 2024 meetings

- Hold again in Nairobi in first quarter
- Tentative theme: "Sub-National Tailoring"
- Two-day partners meeting followed immediately by two-day digitalization meeting
- If agenda allows, end AMP 2024 Partners Meeting by 15:30pm on day two
  - ✓ Allow bilateral meetings before digitalization meeting
  - ✓ Avoids meetings concurrent with plenary sessions

# AMP weekly meetings

#### 2023 results for AMP weekly calls:

- Number of themed presentation in 2023: 13 presentations
- Average number of participants: 30 participants
- Number of suscribers on mailchimp: 561 subscribers
- Percentage of email opened for AMP: 40%

#### **Actions:**

- Call reminders to exclude longer list of country specific minutes
- CG to suggest theme-specific calls bi-monthly (all partners welcome to suggest as well!)

### Working group updates

- Innovation and Evaluation WG:
  - Explore renaming WG, identify new co-chair
- New proposed "Humanitarian & At-Risk Populations Working Group (HARP)"
  - TORs:
    - Improve access to and use of effective and appropriate vector control tools in displaced populations, in coordination with UNHCR, WHO-GMP
    - Identify critical issues related to ITN delivery among displaced populations
  - ACTIONS: finalize WG and co-chair TORs, communicate co-chair opportunity
- Net Mapping Project: further discuss ways to reflect local ITN production in reporting

# Other communications actions

- Consider options to incorporate CD website into AMP website to increase its profile and use
- Explore ways to expand communications on AMP-supported achievements:
  - Success of achieving 85% of AMP TA providers coming from countries with malaria burden
  - Encouraging more use of national consultants to complement AMP TA providers
  - Coordinating messaging UNF, USAID-PMI, IFRC, RBM, WHO and other key partners on expected achievement in 2023 of three billion ITNs shipped later this year



# Looking to late 2023-2024

- Overhaul AMP Toolkit, include updated information from other partner working groups (integration, SBC WG, VCWG)
- Activate internal TA evaluation system: TA provider self-evaluations, opportunity for feedback
- Focus more on continuous distribution support, including TA provider training
